### **TECHINICAL SERGEANT MARK E. LOCKWOOD**

Technical Sergeant Mark E. Lockwood is a Crew Chief for the Missile Warning Operations Center, DOC, at the 213th Space Warning Squadron, Clear AFS, Alaska. TSgt Lockwood is also ready to perform operational duty as a fully mission ready Space Systems Crew Chief where he exercises operational control of a \$250 million phased-array radar detection weapon system (AN/FPS-123). TSgt Lockwood supports the Joint Space Operations Center by detecting and recording characteristics of high-interest satellites. The operations crew verbally relays critical early warning and attack characterization data to Missile Warning Center (MWC). Operations crew members must provide a human assessment to the MWC within 60 seconds of missile detection.

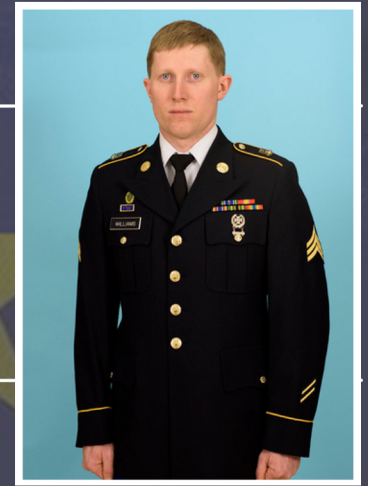


### SERGEANT TRAVIS HALL

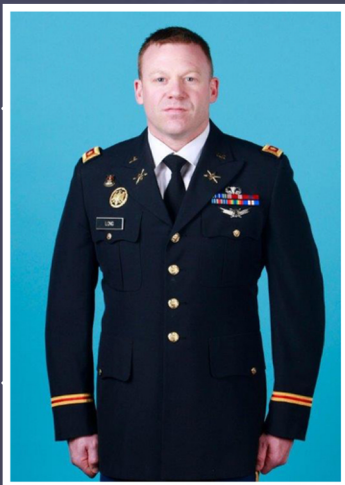

His one unit station training (OUST) for 19D Cavalry Scout took place February 4th 2009 and ended June 9th 2009 in Ft. Knox Kentucky. During his time at OUST SGT Williams became an expert in US small arms weapons, call for fire, land navigation, Route, area, and zone reconnaissance these skills were needed to be a successful scout. After returning home to Eagle River, AK Sergeant Williams, joined the 297th Bravo Troop as an E-1/Private. On October 2010 Sergeant Williams was placed on ADOS orders as a member of the Military Funeral Honors team for a year where he also met his wife of six years. On the spring of 2011 Sergeant Williams applied for an Active Guard Reserve title 32 position at Fort Greely, AK. That same year he was accepted as an E-3/Private First Class, and signed a contract for a 3 year tour with Alpha Company 49th Missile Defense Battalion as a Military Policeman. Sergeant Williams attended Military Police MOSQ course phase I and II in August 2011 in Rickenbacker Air Station Columbus Ohio.

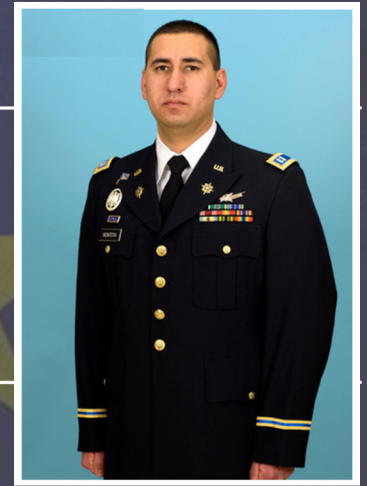
### MAJOR MICHAEL THOMAS LONG

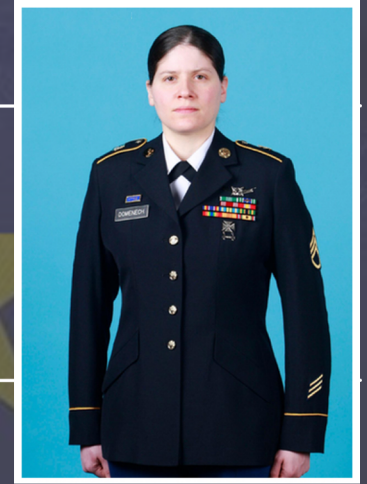


### FIRST LIEUTENANT RACHEL SIMMONS

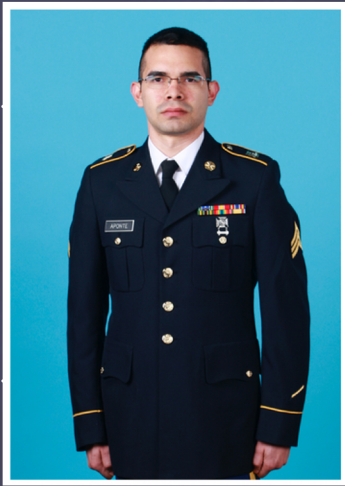
