Each year the award is given to a United States Armed Forces service member from each branch that currently deploys a U.S. missile defense system for their outstanding work in the previous year. 


Chief Petty Officer Zachary Quirk

Chief Petty Officer Zachary Quirk enlisted in the Navy in June 2011 and completed Recruit Training in Great Lakes, Illinois, After graduating from Fire Controlman class "A" school, he then completed SPY-1 B/BV/D training at Aegis Training and Readiness Center, Dahlgren, Virginia. In 2017, CPO Quirk volunteered as an Individual Augmentee to the Combined Air and Space Operations Center (CAOC) on Al Udied Air Base, Qatar in support of Operation Spartan Shield, Inherent Resolve, Restore Hope, and Freedom Sentinel. CPO Quirk developed and led CAOC Integration Training for vessels operating in the 5th Fleet Area of Responsibility which dramatically improved Naval integration into the overall CENTCOM air defense design. During his time there, CPO Quirk also assumed the role of BMD Liason Officer, typically a Navy O3/O4 postition, and was the intermediary between deployed Naval BMD assets and the Area Air Defense Commander. During this period, he identified a communication breakdown and drove the creation of a new Upper-Tier BMD communication net which improved communication flow between joint missile defense units from the Navy, Army, and Air Force. In the final period of CPO Quirk's CENTCOM deployment, he qualified as Senior Air Defense Officer (SADO), a position normally filled by an Air Force O₃/O₄. He was the first enlisted service member to qualify as a SADO since the start of Operation Inherent Resolve in June of 2014. CPO Quirk is currently stationed onboard USS Russell (DDG 59), where he serves as a CF Division Leading Chief Petty Officer and SPY-1D technician. CPO Quirk's personal decorations include the Air Force Commendation Medal, Navy, and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (three awards) and various campaign and service medals.

First Lieutenant Benjamin Schiff

First Lieutenant Benjamin Schiff was born in Nephi, UT and grew up in Detroit, MI. In 2008, he enlisted in the United States Army as a 36B, Financial Management Specialist. In 2014, he commissioned as an Air Defense Artillery Officer through the United States Military Academy at West Point. 1LT Schiff's first assignment was as a Launcher Platoon Leader for Bravo Battery, 5-7 ADA, 10th AAMDC in Kaiserslautern, Germany. In 2016, 1LT Schiff moved to HHB, 5-7 ADA in Baumholder, Germany as a Tactical Director. He is currently serving as the Fire Direction Center Officer in Charge for 5-7 ADA. 1LT Schiff's awards and decorations include two Army Commendation Medals, two Army Achievement Medals, National Defense Service Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal, Army Service Ribbon, two Holland Four Day Event Medals, and the Israeli Air Defense Officers Badge (Gold). 1LT Schiff holds a bachelor's degree in Psychology from the United States Military Academy. His military education includes Patriot Top Gun, Multi-Tactical Data Link Advanced Joint Interoperability Course, NATO Ground Based Air Defense Tactical Evaluation Course, United States Army Combative Level 1 and 2, and the Air Defense Artillery Officer's Basic Course. He is married to Stephanie Schiff of Warren, MI.

Lieutenant Colonel Rocco Angiolelli

Lieutenant Colonel Rocco Angiolelli is the Chief, Defensive Operations, 603d Air Operations Center, Ramstein Air Base, Germany. In this capacity, he leads seven Airmen responsible for real-time monitoring and execution of air and space power missions. He plans, coordinates and executes combined/joint theater missile defense for both USEUCOM and USAFRICOM areas of responsibility, and is the Joint Force Air Component Commander's primary representative for integrated air and missile defense mission execution. In 2017, Lt. Col Angiolelli had the best operations rate in four years that protected 112 million people in 32 million square miles. Lt. Col Angiolelli refined the BMD defense design in seven joint/coalition exercises and command and controlled 300 simulated missile intercepts that validated EUCOM tactics, techniques and procedures (TTPs). During this time, Lt. Col Angiolelli monitored over 75 actual theater ballistic missile launches and briefed senior leaders, defending six million civilians from missile threats. Lt. Col Angiolelli also updated the command and control system architecture/reporting and solidified 11 TTPs for 30 international partners' defense. Lt. Col also led Integrated Air and Missile Defense for the largest Command Post Exercise in the DoD and drove defense solutions to EUCOM. Lt Col Angiolelli is a 2003 Distinguished Graduate of the Air Reserve Officers Training Corps and is a Senior Air Battle Manager with over 1,500 flight hours. He has controlled global air operations to include mission sets such as weapons control, surveillance, identification and high value airborne asset employment during multiple operational combat deployments in both the E-38B/C Sentry and Control and Reporting Center. Prior to his current assignment, Lt. Col Angiolelli attended Air Command and Staff College in residence program at Maxwell AFB, Alabama, graduating in June 2016.

Captain Jason Brewer

Captain Jason Brewer entered the U.S. Army in 2008 and had his first assignment with Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment U.S. Army Alaska XO/S1 at Fort Richardson, Alaska. In 2016, CPT Brewer became the Missile Defense Operations Chief at the 100th Missile Defense Brigade (MDB) in Colorado Springs, Colorado. In 2017, as the Brigade Missile Defense Operations Officer in Charge (MD-Ops OIC), CPT Brewer is incredibly vital to the team and involved in nearly every aspect of the Ground-Based Mid-Course Defense (GMD) enterprise. CPT Brewer was directly responsible for the 100th MDB's planning and execution of the GMD Fire Control 7.A software upgrade development and testing in conjuction with the Missile Defense Agency and NORTHCOM. Additionally, he led a team to test NORTHCOM's updated tactics, techniques, and procedures (TTPs) and provided changes for improvement. CPT Brewer then trained all GMD crews on the new TTPs to ensure a successful transition. CPT Brewer also served as the lead BMD evaluator for the Brigade, in which he conducted over 30 evaluations on both MDE and FDC crews and through his methodical evaluation technique and feedback, ensured the readiness of all GMD crews across the nation. During perhaps the highest OPTEMPO year in the 100th BDE's history, CPT Brewer played a critical role in training and enabling crews to meet the 24-7 readiness requirements in defense of the homeland and led the unit's successful test initiatives to ensure our nation continues to have the most effective and modern missile defense system in the world. CPT Brewer's personal decorations include the two Army Commendation Medals, two Army Achievement Medals, National Defense Service Medal, and the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal. He is married to Christy Brewer and have two daughters; Austen (age 16) and Ashton (Age 14).
