AWARD HISTORY



Defender of the Year

January 14, 2011 marked the inaugural Defender of the Year Award Ceremony, recognizing and honoring members of our military who command fully operational and deployed missile defense systems. The event recognized a United States Armed Forces service member from each branch, that currently deploys a U.S. missile defense system, for their outstanding work in the previous year. The even has since become an annual tradition and has been expanded to include the NORAD & USNORTHCOM Missile Warning and Defender of the Year in Colorado, established in 2013; the Alaska Missile Defender of the Year, established in 2014; the Guam Missile Defender of the Year, established in 2015; the Indo-Pacific Air and Missile Defender of the Year, established in 2019.

Defender of the Year Award Ceremonies have also expanded beyond the U.S. homeland to recognize the best regional missile defenders from the U.S. and U.S. allies to include the Peninsula Defender of the Year, established in 2012 with our allies in the Republic of Korea; the Okinawa Missile Defender of the Year; established in 2013 with our allies in Okinawa, Japan; the Gulf Cooperation Council Air and Missile Defender of the Year, established in 2014 with our allies in the Gulf Cooperation Council; and the European Missile Defender of the Year, established in 2014 with our allies in Europe.

We want to thank all those who have supported MDAA for over a decade to fulfill its mission to educate the American public on the need for our nation to develop and deploy missile defense.

These skills were March Order and Emplacement, General Knowledge, MIDS/SADL radio initialization, Troop Leading Procedures, and Deployment Readiness Exercise testing. SPC Mandt volunteered for and taught a SINCGARS class, streamlined the process for requesting resupply of consumable items, and became a subject matter expert on the BlueSky Mast and Rajant Radio. During mission planning for a potential outside the Continental U.S. MDP Mission, Team 4 took the initiative to help plan and coordinate the weighing and load planning of all MDP equipment in preparation for the planned airlift. This mission would have been the first of its kind and the work they did set the standard for future units to follow. As a team, SPC Mandt and SPC Gibson identified the need for an update to the MDP Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) in regard to the testing and configuration of the MOXA Modem in a classroom environment. This vital task had been overlooked by at least six MDP rotations that came before them. After conducting testing and troubleshooting with the 263rd Army Air and Missile Defense Command, the team developed and trained the SOP resulting in consistent testing of the MOXA Modem over Cradle Point, SPC Mandt began his military service in 2014, enlisting into the North Dakota National Guard (NDNG) as a Combat Engineer. He is currently attending North Dakota State University for Veterinary Technology, SPC Mandt's awards and decorations include the Army Reserve Component Achievement Medal with 1 Oak Leaf Cluster, the National Defense Service Medal, the Army Service Ribbon, the NDNG Commendation Ribbon, the NDNG Emergency Service Ribbon, NDNG Service Ribbon, and the NDNG Basic Combat Training Ribbon.





Specialist Christopher Gibson Sentinel Team Awardee

SPC Gibson scored a 96% on the General Knowledge which is in the top 15% of the MDP. SPC Gibson standardized the MDP mission boxes by developing a load out plan with serialized 1750's that increased overall platoon mission readiness. Additionally, SPC Gibson is highly sought after for his vastly superior knowledge of the 14G and the Air Defense mission within the National Capital Region. During mission planning for a potential outside the Continental U.S. MDP Mission, Team 4 took the initiative to help plan and coordinate the weighing and load planning of all MDP equipment in preparation for the planned airlift. This mission would have been the first of its kind and the work that they did set the standard for future units to follow. Staff Sergeant Alexander Bryson Battalion JADOC Operations Team Awardee


